DIALOGUE

- A: <u>Have you heard the news?</u>
- **B: What happened?**
- A: Mary went into labor and had her baby last week.
- B: She did? Why didn't anyone tell me?

A: I would've thought that somebody would have told you.

B: No, I had no idea.

A: Well, she did, her baby was <u>8 pounds 6 ounces</u>. B: Oh my God, that's great!

A: Are you going to visit her and the baby? B: I think that I might.

A: Good! I just thought I'd let you know.

B: Thanks for telling me.

NEW EXPRESSIONS!

Have you heard the news?

A question using present perfect tense, which is formed with the auxiliary verb "have" and the past participle of the verb.

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Have you heard about it? Have you learned it yet?

I would've thought that somebody would have told you.

Another way of saying I would think which is used in situations when you found out that something that you believed in isn't actually the case.

She would've thought that. I would've thought the same thing

8 pounds 6 ounces.

The measurement system is different in the U.S. 1 kg equals about 2.2 pounds.

I think that I might.

We use the modal verb might whenever we're not sure about something.

- She *might* be pregnant.
- l *might* go out tonight.

I just thought I'd let you know.

Whenever you think about doing something and you report that idea to somebody you use the structure I thought I would

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Thanks for telling me

We always add the ING in the verb after "thanks for". That happens because we have the preposition "for" after "thanks".

Thanks for coming tonight. Thanks for letting me crash on your couch.
