We use it to say that something will happen immediately after something else has happened.

As soon as we get the tickets we'll send them to you.

Ask him to call me **as soon as** he arrives.

Give someone a buzz

To call someone on the phone.

She'll **give me a buzz** on Monday.

I'll **give you a buzz** when I get there.



To settle in

To become adapted and at ease in a new home or environment.

They'll soon **settle in** - kids are very good at adjusting.

John took some time off to help me **settle in**.

To lose touch

To unintentionally decrease the frequency of communication with someone over time until no further contact takes place.

I tend **to lose touch** with my friends easily.

My best friend is moving to Seattle and I'm afraid **to lose touch** with him.
