Give someone a buzz

To call someone on the phone

She'll give me a buzz on Monday.

I'll give you a buzz when I get there.



To settle in

To become adapted and at ease in a new home or environment.

They'll soon settle in - kids are very good at adjusting.

John took some time off to help me settle in.

To lose touch

To unintentionally decrease the frequency of communication with someone over time until no further contact takes place.

I tend to lose touch with my friends easily.

My best friend is moving to Seattle and I'm afraid to lose touch with him.
