NEW EXPRESSIONS!

Should we

A modal verb we use to indicate obligation, duty or what is probable to happen, paired with the pronoun “we”. In this structure, it’s a question, but it can be used to form phrases in the affirmative and negative.

Should we go out for dinner?

Should I ask for a raise?

We should pay our bills early this month.

She shouldn't speak to her parents like that.

Do it yourself

An expression that means to do something on your own, without any help. Usually abbreviated in the arts and crafts world to “DIY”.

If she won't help you, you should **do it yourself**.

It's not hard, you can **do it yourself**.

Oh, I'm very crafty. I'll just **do it myself**.

Get to be

Get to be can have a couple of different meanings, as most words and expressions. It can mean “to become”, “have the ability to be” or “can be”.

I don't think I'll **get to be** a lawyer.

She has the support of her family, so she **gets to be** anything she wants.



Work on

A phrasal verb that means “improving”.

He’s **working on** learning Spanish.

I should **work on** my manners.

Hanging up

A phrasal verb that means to disconnect the phone call.

I’m **hanging up** before you get crazy.

I can’t believe she **hung up** on me.
