NEW EXPRESSIONS!

Get in trouble

To do something that is illegal, prohibited or forbidden and to be punished for it, to fall into difficulty.

Don't try to sneak out, you'll **get in trouble**.

If I get a bad grade on this test, I'll **get in trouble**.

Why would we

A conditional phrase, in which “would” questions the motivation behind someone's actions.

Why would I break your favorite vase?

It's pouring out, **why would we** leave the house?

Prank

A practical joke, mischievous act or to play a trick.

James is always **pranking** me.

Stop it! You know she hates **pranks**.



Incredibly

An adverb that means “to a great degree”, “extremely” or “unusually”.

Jackie was **incredibly** brave.

The test was **incredibly** difficult.

Foolish

An adjective that means something lacks good sense or judgement.

Don't climb the side of the building, that's **foolish**!

She was **foolish** to believe their lies.

April Fools

April Fools' Day or April Fools is an annual celebration in which people play practical jokes, tell lies and prank others.
