# NEW EXPRESSIONS!

#### All ears

An expression that means someone has your full attention, that you are listening to whatever it is being said.

I'm all ears for any plans you have.
I told her I wanted to talk and she was all ears.

### **Brunch**

A meal between "breakfast" and "lunch". There are several brunch places, that serve a combination of breakfast food and lunch meals.

#### Yet

A word that describes something that is not finished. It indicates that an action is still to be finished, or close to its conclusion. Usually used at the end of sentences.

I didn't finish reading all my books yet. Mary hasn't graduated yet.

### Think outside the box

An expression that means to be creative when looking for solutions. It means to avoid going for the obvious solutions and expand your mind.

Stephen Hawking was a genius, always thinking outside the box. She has a big problem. She'll have to think outside the box to come up with a solution.



## Catches her eye

An expression that indicates that something has caught her attention.

I've been looking for a dress, but nothing is catching my eye. He'll choose the ring when it catches his eye.

#### It's a date

An expression that indicates an agreement has been made, or an appointment settled. It's often used to indicate that you agree to someone else's plans involving you.
