Grinning

It means to invite someone to go out with you somewhere, especially in a romantic way. It generally indicates you have romantic feelings for the other person.

He asked me out when he found out I was single.

Did she ask you out?

Read someone like a book

An expression that means to understand someone's thoughts and motives clearly, without the need for explanations.

I can read you like a book, I can see something is wrong.

Jack can't lie to his mom, she reads him like a book.



Valentine's Day

In the United States and most of the world, Valentine's Day is celebrated on February 14th. In Brazil, the holiday is celebrated on June 12th since 1948. The reason behind it is purely commercial.

Head over heels

An idiom or expression that means to be madly in love, “out of control in love”, completely in love.

When I met James, I was head over heels for him immediately.

You should see them together, it's so clear they are head over heels in love.
