NEW EXPRESSIONS!

Do just fine

It means that something is satisfactory, well, or acceptable.

She's smart, I'm sure she'll do just fine at her new job.

I want something light. A salad will do just fine, thank you.

Will simply not do

The opposite of "do fine", it means that something won't work, be useful, or be good enough.

This sweater has a hole in it, it simply will not do.

We can't serve this cake, it's falling apart. It will simply not do.

Worrywart

Someone who focuses on the negative, worries too much or dwells on difficulties and problems unnecessarily.

My mother is such a worrywart.

Don't listen to him, he's a worrywart.

Catnap

A small nap, a light, short sleep. It can be used as a verb or a noun.

I always catnap after lunch.

She took a catnap before going out.
