# NEW EXPRESSIONS!

### Be supposed to

Something that is expected or intended to happen; someone is expected to do or behave in a certain way. It means to be required or under orders. Also used to say that something is believed to be true. Using "there" before it, it's used to say that something is expected to happen.

She was supposed to be at work two hours ago
I'm not supposed to talk to strangers.
There were supposed to be a hundred people at the party.

### **Meteor shower**

An occasion when a number of meteors move fast across the sky.

Approximately thirty meteor showers happen in a year. There will be a meteor shower on August 12th.

### l've never seen

A sentence using the "Present Perfect" structure. Present Perfect is used to describe something that happened in the past but is still linked to the present. It's formed by using the present tense of the verb "have" and the past participle tense of the verb that follows.

I have never been to Disney.

She has been living in Rio for two years.



## **Outskirts**

It means the outer parts of a town or city, the edge of a place.

The pool was built on the outskirts of the property. I work in a factory on the outskirts of the city.
