DIALOGUE

- B: Peter! I can't believe it! You know better than that.
- A: I know, I should be more careful online.

Would

"Would" is a modal verb. That means it modifies the verb it accompanies. All modal verbs don't need an auxiliary such as "do". In negative sentences, it's accompanied by "not". It's also the past of "will" in many senses. Frequently used in conditionals to indicate the consequences of imaginary actions.

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Would you like to come over?

EXPAND YOUR KNOWLEDGE!

I wouldn't do that if I were you.

He would approve of this.

They said they would be out of office this week.

Otherwise

An adverb or adjective. As an adverb, it means "in different circumstances than the ones present", "apart from that", "in other respects". As an adjective, it means "in a different state or situation".

We must water the plants; otherwise, they will die. You'll have no alternative, otherwise.

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Might

A modal verb. It's the past of "may" and it can be used with the same meaning as "maybe". It accompanies and modifies a verb. It can mean "it's possible that".

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He might be sick. They might not understand your reasons. It might rain later.

Know better

An expression that means "to be smart and sensible enough not to do something". It's used when you're saying someone shouldn't do something, because they know it won't be good for them. .

You know better than to talk to the professor like that.

I can't believe she did that. She knows better.
