DIALOGUE

Peter: Good! I'm <u>craving</u> hot dogs!

Amy: I'm not sure I'm down for that.

Peter: Don't they have something else?

Amy: Oh yeah! I heard their French fries and burgers are to die for.

Peter: Then what are we waiting for?



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Though

It can be a conjunction and an adverb. It means "despite the fact", "although", "however".

They have a lot of nephews. No kids of their own, though. Her name was Evangeline, though no one called her that.

Two streets down

When giving directions, it's possible to use "up" and "down" as a way of telling someone where to go. "Two streets down" would mean that from where they are, if they move down the two streets, they will find the place.

The grocery store is down the street, to the left. Don't worry, I live two blocks up.

Craving

It means "a powerful desire for something". Used commonly to describe what a woman might want to eat when pregnant.

I'm craving some hot chocolate.

My mom had the weirdest cravings when she was pregnant with me.



Down for that

"To be down for something" is an informal expression, used to express agreement or acceptance of something.

Sure, let's go out! I'm down for anything.

Hey, are you down for a beer?

To die for

An informal way of saying something is extremely good or desirable. When talking about food, it indicates that it's delicious.

Would you like a cookie? They're to die for.

She makes the most delicious lasagna. It's to die for.
