DIALOGUE

Steve: Ow, my back is killing me.

Annie: Did you hurt it?

Steve: No, I think I slept wrong. Or it's from sitting all day. Annie: Well, you need to work on your posture. Maybe doing some pilates, yoga or stretching will help.

Steve: I know, I was exercising daily, but things got hectic and I haven't had the time.

Annie: I have a back massager you can borrow, if you want.

Steve: Yeah, until I can get back to exercising, that's gonna have to do.

NEW EXPRESSIONS!

Work on

A phrasal verb, formed by combining the verb "work" with the preposition "on". It means to spend time producing or improving something.

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She has to work on getting in shape! I've been working on my cooking skills.

Past Continuous Was exercising

Hectic

The past continuous describes actions or events in a time before now, which began in the past and were still going on when another event occurred. The past continuous of any verb is composed of two parts : the past tense of the verb "to be" (was/were), and the base of the main verb +ing.

I was taking a shower. He was talking about his plans when we arrived. They were studying together. We weren't speaking to her. It was raining. She wasn't jogging when we spoke. You were being sarcastic.

An adjective that means "full of incessant or frantic activity".

- She has a hectic business schedule.
- The weeks leading up to the holidays are always hectic.

Get back

It means "to come or go again to a person, place, or condition"; or "to gain revenge", usually used with at; or "to regain possession of".

- I want to get back to studying.
- He was trying to get back at his ex.

They said they would do anything to get back their dog. Let's get back to the main topic.

Gonna have to do

An expression meaning "it's going to have to be enough". Used mainly when something is not ideal or perfect, but it's the best you can do in the moment.

I didn't have time to go grocery shopping, so takeout is gonna have to do.

She doesn't have money for a new dress, so borrowing from someone is gonna have to do.
