# NEW EXPRESSIONS!

## If... would Conditional

The second conditional is usually formed by using the word "if" in conjunction with the modal verb "would". It's used to talk about an imaginary situation, something that is not real. It's formed by the "if" clause and the "result", shown by the use of "would". The order of those clauses doesn't matter in the sentence.

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If you knew the truth, you wouldn't be angry.

She would feel lonely if she moved cities.

If I were rich, I would travel all over the world.

If he had a car, he wouldn't need to borrow mine.

They would be sad if we didn't invite them.

I would love you forever if you bought me that ring.

### Pounds

The word "pound" has two meanings. It can mean the standard unit of money used in the UK and some other countries, symbolized by £, or it

can mean the unit for measuring weight. In this conversation, it means the weight. A pound is around 454 grams.

One **pound** is approximately equal to 454 grams.

Ann's baby weighed eight and a half pounds at birth.

#### Once

"Once" means "after the fact", "when".

Once you try Thai food you will want more. You can pay for it once you get here.
